Drug & Alcohol Policy

DRUG-FREE SCHOOL AND WORKPLACE STATEMENT

In accordance with the Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act amendments of 1989, Public Law 101-226, Hussian College, School of Art is hereby declared a drug and alcohol free school and workplace.

STUDENT AND EMPLOYEES are prohibited from the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensing, possession or use of a controlled substance or alcohol anywhere on property belonging to Hussian College, School of Art and anywhere within the building, or while participating in school-related activities. Students or employees who violate this policy will be subject to disciplinary action up to and including expulsion or termination of employment.

Hussian College, School of Art does permit the consumption, in moderation, of alcoholic beverages during certain approved functions involving external groups and only by persons of legal drinking age (21 years or above). A nonalcoholic beverage and food must also be served.

As a condition of enrollment or employment, students and employees must abide by the terms of the policy or Hussian College, School of Art will take one or more of the following actions within 30 days with respect to any student or employee who violates this policy by:

1. Reporting the violation to law enforcement officials.
2. Taking appropriate disciplinary action against such student or employee, up to and including expulsion or termination of employment.
3. To recommend such student or employee to participate in a substance abuse rehabilitation program approved for such purposes by a federal, state, local health, law enforcement or other appropriate agency.

In conformance with the law, Hussian College, School of Art will make a good faith effort to maintain a drug and alcohol free school and workplace through implementation of the preceding policy and will establish and maintain a drug and alcohol free awareness program.

In accordance with Pennsylvania law:

- * The legal drinking age in Pennsylvania is 21: persons under the age of 21 may not consume, purchase or possess alcohol.
- * It is unlawful to sell or furnish alcoholic beverages to persons under the age of 21.
- * It is unlawful for persons under the age of 21 to misrepresent one's age for the purpose of purchasing alcoholic beverages.
- It is illegal to possess, consume, and or sell illicit drugs including marijuana, narcotics, hallucinogens, amphetamines and barbiturates.

Illegal drugs include but are not limited to the following nonprescription substances:

1. Narcotics - opium, heroin, morphine and synthetic substitutes.
2. Depressants - choral hydrate, barbiturates and methaqualone
3. Stimulants - cocaine (and derivatives such as crack) and amphetamines
4. Hallucinogens - LSD, mescaline, PCP, peyote, psilocybin and MDMA
5. Cannabis - marijuana and hashish
